BUSING INFORMATION & CONDUCT GUIDELINES

Bus transportation is a service provided by resident districts and is considered a privilege. All students are expected to conduct themselves in a manner complimentary to the standards of Penn View Christian School.

The following rules are established to ensure student safety to and from school.

RULES FOR BUS CONDUCT

- ◆ Follow instructions given by the bus driver.
- ◆ Stay seated, facing the front, with feet out of aisles.
- ◆ Speak quietly.
- ◆ Respect others.
- ◆ Eating is not permitted on the bus.

OTHER BUSING INFORMATION

1. Students should be at their bus stops 5 to 10 minutes prior to the scheduled arrival of their buses.
2. Students living on the opposite side of the road from the bus stop should wait on that side until the bus has arrived, safely stopped, and has restrained all other traffic by safety signs and flashers. Students should then cautiously proceed across the road in front of the bus, watching for vehicles that may not have stopped for the bus.
3. While waiting to board the bus, students should stand in an orderly line, off of the road, at least three feet from the bus.
4. District transportation offices have established all stops for their buses. School buses are authorized to stop **only at those established stops.**
5. Students from the Souderton and North Penn School Districts may ride home on other buses from their own district **only if they have written notes from their parents that have been signed by the Principal or Administrative Assistant.**
6. Students who are taking a guest home on his/her bus must have a written note from a parent stating this as well. These notes also have to be signed as stated in #5 above.
7. **Due to insurance concerns, districts do not permit riders who are residents of another district.**

Inclement Weather Bulletin

If Inclement Weather Develops Overnight

1. What do I do if Penn View is closed?

Do not send your children to school.

2. What do I do if Penn View has a 2 hour delay, but my district opens at the normal time?

Bring your children to school between 10:00-10:25 a.m.

3. What do I do if Penn View is on time, but my district has a 2 hour delay?

❖ Bring your children to school before 8:25 a.m.

OR

❖ Send your children on the bus according to your district's 2 hour delay schedule. Students who arrive after school has begun will not be counted tardy.



4. Morning Kindergarten

If Penn View opens on a 2 hour delay, morning kindergarten will be cancelled. Please do not send your child to school.

5. Early Childhood / Pre-kindergarten

If Penn View has a 2 hour delay, morning early childhood classes will be cancelled. Please do not bring your child to school. However, full day early childhood classes and full day pre-kindergarten will begin 2 hours late.

If Inclement Weather Develops During the Day

1. What do I do if Penn View closes early, but my district remains open?

- ❖ Use our web site, radio, or television for closing information on Penn View and your busing district.
- ❖ When Penn View makes the decision to close early, all busing districts are contacted and bus services are requested. Buses will arrive at Penn View as soon as busing companies can provide them. Bus departure times will be posted on the Penn View website. Please have a plan in place in the event your children come home early.

2. What do I do if Penn View remains open, but my district closes?

- ❖ Use our web site, radio, or television for closing information on Penn View and your busing district.
- ❖ Penn View will continue classes as normal. If a bus from a district arrives, students will be sent home on the bus, unless other arrangements have been made. Please have a plan in place in the event your children come home early.

3. Early Childhood / Pre-kindergarten

If it snows during school hours, parents are welcome to pick up children any time prior to dismissal. Safety is our first and foremost consideration.
